

MUSEO CASA DE MONEDA

This Museum displays Banco de la República's numismatic collection consisting of coins, banknotes, documents and machines which describe the country's economic history from pre-Hispanic times to the present day.



MUSEO BOTERO

208 works are exhibited in its galleries, 123 of them by the famous artist Fernando Botero; the remaining 85 are international artworks by renowned exponents of modern art, such as Monet, Renoir, Dalí, Picasso, Francis Bacon and Alexander Calder. This collection was a donation made in 2000 by Fernando Botero to Banco de la República for the enjoyment of all Colombians.

MAMU - ART COLLECTION

MAMU is dedicated to the exhibition of representative works of Colombian, Latin American and worldwide art which constitute part of the permanent collection. The aim is to foster a dialogue between Colombian and international plastic art and to compare works from different historical periods.




