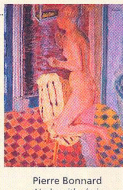

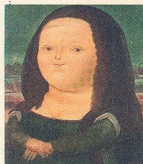

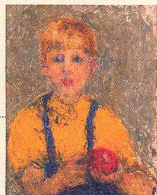

MUSEO CASA DE MONEDA

This Museum displays Banco de la República's numismatic collection consisting of coins, banknotes, documents and machines which describe the country's economic history from pre-Hispanic times to the present day.



MUSEO BOTERO

208 works are exhibited in its galleries, 123 of them by the famous artist Fernando Botero; the remaining 85 are international artworks by renowned exponents of modern art, such as Monet, Renoir, Dalí, Picasso, Francis Bacon and Alexander Calder. This collection was a donation made in 2000 by Fernando Botero to Banco de la República for the enjoyment of all Colombians.

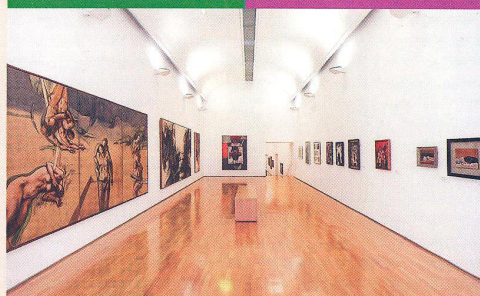

MAMU - ART COLLECTION

MAMU is dedicated to the exhibition of representative works of Colombian, Latin American and worldwide art which constitute part of the permanent collection. The aim is to foster a dialogue between Colombian and international plastic art and to compare works from different historical periods.

- 1 The Early Modern Times (16th - 18th centuries)
- 2 Ruptures and Continuities: Art in the Nineteenth Century
- 3 1910 - 1950: Plural Art in Latin America
- 4 Classical, Experimental and Radical: 1950 - 1980
- 5 Three Decades of Art in Expansion: 1980 to the present. Located in **Casa Republicana** at Luis Angel Arango Library.

MAMU holds national and international temporary exhibitions. The Museum has workshops for educational activities, an auditorium, and a project space for the experimentation with contemporary art called: **El Parquero.**

Also visit **Casa Gómez Campuzano**, which houses the collection of the painter Ricardo Gómez Campuzano (1891-1981). Located in Calle 80 # 8-66.
